At September's regular meeting, which will be held at 6:30 on Sept. 8th, we will be getting order forms with the particulars for the Commemorative Veteran's Flags Fundraiser. Sal Vaccarino has done a terrific job coordinating and putting this project together even through the trials of 2020. You can purchase them to honor a veteran with a photo, dates, branch and location of duty. This will allow us to have our veterans' flags up in the town of Newport on Main Street for every patriotic holiday each year. Depending on how many we have made, they will be rotated each holiday to display them all. We also intend to have display polls at the new Post home. (See the article on next page.)

As the summer draws to a close, hopefully we will have enough customers to justify being open more days per week. Remember the canteen is a business that needs to be self-supporting. We should start seeing a rise in the number of functions both food and activities. We will be soon scheduling a flag sorting work detail for the flags we used and recovered from Gracelawn. Also the roof on the shed by the dumpster still needs repaired.

And for all of our members who have not yet paid 2021 dues, if you possibly can **PLEASE** get them paid now instead of waiting for the end of the year. It makes our Post have a better goal rating with the Department, it could earn the Post a financial reward, and it will let our membership people finish

early. It doesn't cost any less to wait for the last minute, so do you're Post a favor and get your next year's dues paid.

He was financially supported by Stahl last year to enable him to have extended visits to two colleges to get a taste of academia life, at Fordham and Yale. Honoring Hometown Hero's

Attached you will find a great opportunity to highlight your service member(s) throughout the town of Newport.

We have agreed with the Newport Police and local community to supply military service highlight banners for their community light poles. We can have our military family and friends proudly displayed on the light posts for all military related holidays. This is a great opportunity to promote and highlight your family service member(s) service to our great Country.

Banners will be placed on and removed from the posts by local DelDOT employees at specified times from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Once they are removed, the banner will be returned to the family member who ordered it and can be saved for the following year.

Each year we can add to the collection, as new light posts are installed. If we have more banners than posts, it will be first ordered first installed and any remaining banners will get a priority the following year.

The banners will be created and shipped to us for keeping at the Stahl Post until they can be put up in 2021. Once we have received the shipment, I will contact those who ordered to come to Stahl Post to review their banner. In an effort to make sure we meet all deadlines for manufacturing and shipping, we would request that all banner orders be placed and submitted to Stahl Post by December 1st, 2020 to be eligible for the 2021 season.

See the two attached documents. The application must be completely filled out, reviewed and approved to ensure we capture all of your service members' proper information. The banner will be printed from the information you provide, so please make sure that it is 100% correct. I will do my best to get pictures returned but there is no guarantee, so please do not send one of a kind or heirloom photos.

All orders must have a photo, if requesting, and be submitted to Stahl Post with your check for payment. No orders will be accepted without photos, order form completed and your check for payment.

United States Air Force

Air Power did not begin with the establishment of the Air Force in 1947. It began with the Army accepting a Wright Flyer, known as Airplane No. 1 on August 2nd, 1909.



The first unit was formally commissioned in 1913 and shortly renamed the 1st Aero Squadron.

When WWI broke out the First Aero Squadron represented the entire tactical strength of the Air Corps—12 officers, 54 enlisted, and six aircraft. It quickly grew into over 180 aero squadrons. After the war, the Air Corps just as quickly demobilized into just one pursuit, one bombardment, and one attack group.

During WWII, the US Army Air Corps would swell to 2,253,000 men and women, and 63,715 aircraft. The Air Force proved they could take the fight directly to the homelands of Germany and Japan, and provide close air support to the ground forces.



The National Security Act of 1947, established the US Air Force as a separate and equal branch of the armed forces. On September 18, 1947, General Carl A. Spaatz became the first Chief of Staff.

The Air Force has been involved in every American conflict providing airlift, defense, strategic bombardment, close air support, interdiction, reconnaissance, cyber style warfare, and nuclear deterrence. Whatever the National Command Authority has asked for, the Air Force has delivered whether in the air or in space.

POW / MIA Remembrance

Key facts to know about the POW/MIA flag.

1972 – As the Vietnam War waged on, people in the US were war weary and began forgetting about those who were held prisoner and those who were missing. To help refocus our attention on this tragic national issue, a flag was created. This flag made appearances off-and-on over the next 17 years.

1979 - The first-ever National POW/MIA Recognition Day was held on July 28th, 1979 after the National League of Families of Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia made it a priority.

1986 - Congress was inspired to pass a resolution designating this a national holiday. From 1986 onward the date was affixed to the third Friday of September.

1989 - The flag made a major comeback when it was flown in the Capitol Rotunda and over the White House to again bring attention to this issue. You may ask, why is this significant? To this day no other flag has been in the Capital or flown above the White House other than the US Flag.

1990 - Congress designated the flag as a national symbol of concern and as a commitment to account for the fate of all Americans in all wars.

1998 - Congress declared that this flag was to be flown with the American flag on six holidays — Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, POW-MIA Recognition Day, and on Veteran's Day.

So remember this black and white flag. It is not a political flag, it is not a club or social organizational flag, it is not a religious flag, and it is not an issue flag. It is a National Flag! Now you know its history and background!
