Busy week here folks. But, also a great week for us. We have officially been notified that the new Post will be

completed by mid- August, with the following two weeks getting final inspections to

get us in by 1 September. September 1st of 2021. CAN YOU BELIEVE IT? Let the good times roll!



Now, there's a lot to be done in the

coming weeks. This Sunday, I need some help with stuffing envelopes with the required notice of the ABC to transfer our liquor license. To not create any confusion, if you can help, let the bartender know on Friday or Saturday of your availability. It would be good if six or seven people could spend about an hour completing the mailings.

Second task is the flags from Gracelawn need to be sorted, hopefully this week, so they will be stored in their cartons and soon moved to the new facility. Teddy is picking them up tomorrow and bringing them to the Hall. I'll put him in charge of that, so check with him on the day and time.

Third, the kitchen equipment will be disconnected by 12 July, and needs to be taken outside, pressure washed, and then taken by us to the new kitchen for re-connecting by the mechanical contractor. That needs to be scheduled for completion by the end of July, so that gives us a two week window at best. Six to eight guys would work out fine, for about five hours of time, which could be one or two days. I will put up a volunteer list in the canteen this week, along with a suggested date. I will discuss this further during our meeting on the 13th, and I am hoping some of the younger members can help with this.

After that, we can start planning moving the safe, office contents, and other things that don't end up getting disposed of. This will be guite a bit of work, but handling this in-house will save the Post a lot of expense. It will contribute to an ongoing effort to eliminate the need for any mortgage on Stahl's new Post home.

Next weekend, July 8, 9 10 is the Legion Convention at Post 2 in Dover. Stahl will attend on Friday and Saturday, with a few members staying overnight. The times will be 9 am starts, finishing around 3:00 Friday, and around noon on Saturday.

I want to say thank you to the members who stepped forward to help our Post. I know not everyone can, not every time they are needed, but we are blessed to have people who always do what they can to make everything come together. It's what makes us the Stahl family.....still serving, since 1950!



July 4th Independence Day

The colonies, after years of frustration with Great Britain and King George, became both highly vocal

and acted out their frustrations. As dissatisfaction grew, British troops were sent in to quell the early movement toward rebellion. Repeated attempts by the Colonists to resolve the crisis without military conflict proved fruitless.

On June 11, 1776, the Colonies' Second Continental Congress met in Philadelphia and formed a committee whose express purpose was drafting a document that would formally sever their ties with Great Britain. The committee included Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, Roger Sherman and Robert R. Livingston. Jefferson, who was considered the strongest and most eloquent writer,

crafted the original draft document. A total of 86 changes were made to his draft and the Continental Congress officially adopted the final version on **July 4, 1776**. America was Born!

The following day, copies of the Declaration of Independence were distributed. On July 6, the Pennsylvania Evening Post became the first newspaper to print the extraordinary document. The Declaration of Independence has since become our nation's most cherished symbol of liberty.

One year later, on July 4, 1777, Philadelphia marked Independence Day by adjourning Congress and celebrating with bonfires, bells and fireworks. The custom eventually spread to other towns, both large and small, where the day was marked with processions, oratory, picnics, contests, games, military displays and fireworks. Observations throughout the nation became even more common at the end of the War of 1812 with Great Britain.

Congress established Independence Day as a holiday in 1870, and in 1938 Congress reaffirmed it as a paid holiday for federal employees. Today, communities across the nation mark this major holiday with parades, firework displays, picnics and performances of "The Star-Spangled Banner" and marches by John Philip Sousa.

Please add your personal touch by displaying your flag for all to see and remember that the values fought from 1776 to today did not come without a sacrifice. We honor and celebrate the brilliance of these brave founding fathers and again thank them for the freedoms we cherish today.
