## Coast Guard

Did you know that what we refer to as the US Coast Guard began as the Revenue Cutter Service on August 4th, 1790 under President George Washington? He signed the Tariff Act which authorized the construction of 10 vessels, known as "cutters" to enforce federal tariff and trade laws, and to prevent smuggling. As such it is one of the oldest branches of the armed forces. In fact, the US Navy was not authorized until 8 years later.

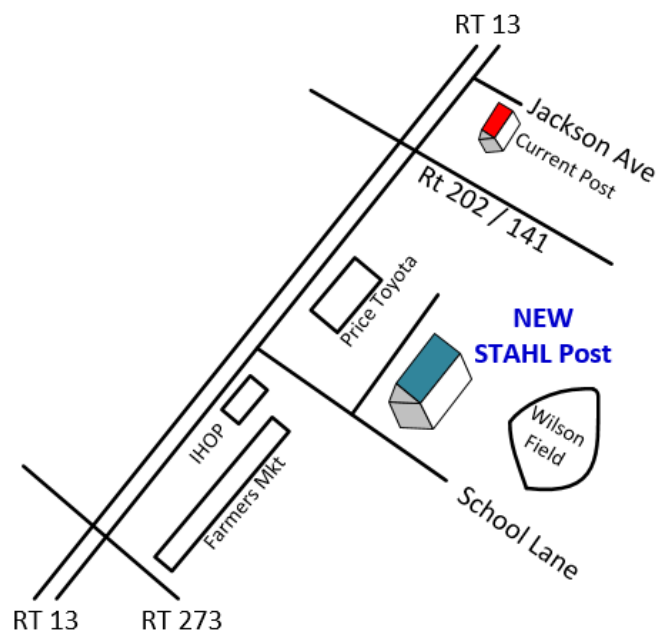
As the nation grew, so did the Revenue Cutter Service. In 1915, it merged with the U.S. Life-Saving Service and was officially renamed to the Coast Guard. Making it the only maritime service dedicated to saving life at sea and enforcing the nation's maritime law.

In 1967 the Coast Guard was transferred to the Department of Transportation and in 2003, it was transferred again, this time to Homeland Security. Thus the Coast Guard is both a federal law enforcement agency as well as a military force. While under Homeland Security in peacetime, the coast guard serves under the Department of the Navy in wartime or at the direction of the President.

As the principal agency for maritime safety and security, the Coast Guard protects over 100,000 miles of coastline. With over 56,000 members, the coast guard operates a multi-mission fleet of 201 fixed and rotary wing aircraft, and over 1,600 boats.



On the average day the Coast Guard conducts 45 search and rescue missions, seizes 874 pounds of cocaine, along with 214 pounds of marijuana, services 82 buoys and fixed navigation aids, screens 360 merchant vessels for potential security threats prior to arrival at US ports, and much much more. And, they do it seamlessly.
